Modern School Barakhamba Road organised the All India IPSC Under 19 Boys' Cricket Championship from 12<sup>th</sup> to 17<sup>th</sup> May 2019.Fifteen schools from across the country participated in the tournament. The Championship was inaugurated on 13<sup>th</sup>May by the Chief Guest Mr Pramod Sharma, Director-Principal, Genesis Global School; the Guests of Honour Mr Ajay Singh, Principal National Curriculum, Genesis Global School; Mr Anil Chaudhary, Senior Umpire BCCI; Mr Prahlad Singh Yadav, SHO, Barakhamba Police Station and our Principal Dr Vijay Datta. The tournament was played on league cum knock-out basis. A gold plated coin was introduced for the toss. Caps for the highest scorer and wicket taker were also introduced for the first time.



Eight teams qualified for the knock-out round. In the first semi-final match MNSS RAI defeated DPS Mathura Road. In the second semi-final match, Modern School defeated Emerald Heights and the Grand Finale was between Modern School Barakhamba Road and MNSS,

Rai. Modern School Barakhamba Road emerged as the winner of the tournament. Ritwik Joshi of Modern School was judged as the best fielder of the tournament. Sahil Wilson of Modern School Barakhamba Road was awarded the Man of the Series Award. He scored 131 runs and took 16 wickets in the tournament. The Prize Distribution was graced by the presence of Ms Ambika Pant, Secretary Board of Trustees, Modern Schools and our Principal Dr Vijay Datta. Modern School lifted the trophy for the fifth consecutive year.
