


SEWA BHARTI COMMUNITY SERVICE PROJECT

The Interact Club of Modern School, Barakhamba Road organised a unique community service project for the students of Classes S1 to S7 in association with Sewa Bharti, New Delhi, during May-June 2019.

Sewa Bharti is a prestigious Non-Governmental Organisation working among the economically weaker sections of Indian society, including tribal and indigenous communities. It works among urban slum dwellers and resettlement colonies by introducing welfare and social service programme, such as free medical assistance, free education, and vocational training. It also runs many schools and centres in the slums of Delhi for underprivileged children.





Under this project, the students were required to render 20 hours of voluntary service spread over 10 days at the assigned Sewa Bharti centres. More than 140 students of Modern School Barakhamba Road participated in this community service programme. volunteers conducted many academic and co-curricular training sessions for the underprivileged children at the Sewa Bharti centres.




During the academic sessions, children were taught English, Hindi and Mathematics, while during the co-scholastic sessions children were taught painting, dancing, singing and art and craft work.

The children were introduced to the concept of recycling and reuse by making them understand how waste material can also be put to good use. Importance of hygiene and good environmental practices was also explained to the children. The compassionate and empathetic volunteers worked with utmost dedication and sincerity to ensure holistic development of the children.

It was truly an enriching experience for both the volunteers and the children as the volunteers gained a new perspective of life along with happiness and satisfaction by helping, guiding and aiding the underprivileged children. 
