On Friday, 26th July 2019, twenty seven students studying Economics of Classes S6 and S7 accompanied by Ms Meera Malhotra and Ms Pooja Goel attended the book launch of Shri V Srinavas's "India's Relations with International Monetary Fund: 25 Years In Perspective 1991-2016". The event was graced by Shri Shaktikanta Das, RBI Governor of India who is also India's Alternate Governor, International Monetary Fund, along with Excellencies like Dr Anoop Singh, Member Finance Commission of India and former Director, Asia Pacific Department, IMF; Shri. K.V. Eapen, Secretary Department of Administrative Reforms and Public Grievances and former Senior Advisor to Executive Director, India, IMF; and Dr. Andreas Bauer, Senior Resident Representative IMF, New Delhi. The programme commenced with a presentation by the author, Shri V Srinavas. This was followed by the official release of the book by the RBI Governor. According to him, "India has undergone a dramatic change in status in IMF from a debtor to creditor and it is which fills an important gap in the serious scholarship on the subject." He pointed out that general government debt of advanced economies, as a group, has surpassed 100% of the GDP, along with constrained fiscal space in many of these countries. It was then followed by the remarks of the esteemed panelists who also spoke on this occasion. The event concluded with a Q and A round where the audience interacted with the panelists. The students were honoured to be a part of this prestigious event. It was a great learning experience for all the students.
