THE EMERGENCY HEALTH CARE WORKSHOP

On 14th November 2019, in collaboration with the Northern Ireland Ambulance Service, Modern School, Barakhamba Road organised The Emergency Health Care Programme 2019, in the HLL Auditorium. The Workshop was conducted by eminent facilitators Mr Chris Callen and Ms Paula Hamilton, who have been associated with emergency health care and paramedic services in Northern Ireland. The occasion was graced with the benign presence of Dr Ela Anand and Ms Nivriti Vaid. Mr Chris Callen and Ms Paula Hamilton talked about the types of medical emergencies such as choking, injury, stroke, wound, bleeding, unconsciousness, heart attack etc. They gave an insight to the students about the strategy to be followed when confronted with such dire situations.

They demonstrated the method of performing *CPR* (Cardio-pulmonary Resuscitation) on the patient to revive him from unconsciousness. The students were given an opportunity to practise CPR on dummies.

It was a highly interactive session in which the students enacted the emergency situations and demonstrated the basic steps of patient rescue. The individual queries of the students were taken up by Mr Chris and Ms Paula in the end. The students enjoyed the session and felt enriched knowing the strategy of facing emergencies without panic.
