World Scholar's Cup

Three students from Modern School Barakhamba Road- Swayam Bhatia, Ambika Pandey and Ishana Aggarwal- participated in World Scholar's Cup 2016 as a team. They cleared the Delhi regional round in January 2016 with the 4th best team award out of a total of 100 teams and qualified for the global round in Bangkok. The Global Round took place from the 25th to 30th of June 2016. Their team competed with 600 other teams from all over the world in the spheres of debating, essay writing and quizzing. The Modern School team bagged the first place in the South Asia region and 31st overall rank amongst teams from all across the globe. The team members received several medals for their achievements and a trophy for standing first in South Asia. They have also qualified for the final round -The Tournament of Champions- which is to take place at Yale University this November.

Intel's Google Big Thinking Awards

Shreyas Kapur, a student from Modern School, Barakhamba Road, New Delhi, was declared the grand winner of the "Google Thinking Big Award" at the Intel International Science and Engineering Fair (ISEF), in Arizona. The meet featured more than 1,700 young scientists selected from 419 affiliate fairs in 77 countries.

Shreyas Kapur won the award for the "project that addresses a large and seemingly-impossible problem, by finding an elegant solution with broad impact". His project titled "Cellphone-based Optometry using Hybrid Images" also won him third position in both the National Aeronautics and Space Administration (NASA) and Biomedical Engineering award. Modern School had sent 28 entries for this competition under various categories as reported by the teacher in charge-Flt Lt Mrs. Sunita Dixit who is presently the in charge of IRIS.




Orientation Programme


Paper Bag Marathon
