An artist carves an image into the surface of a block of wood—typically with gouges—leaving the printing parts level with the surface while removing the non-printing parts. SCULPTURE

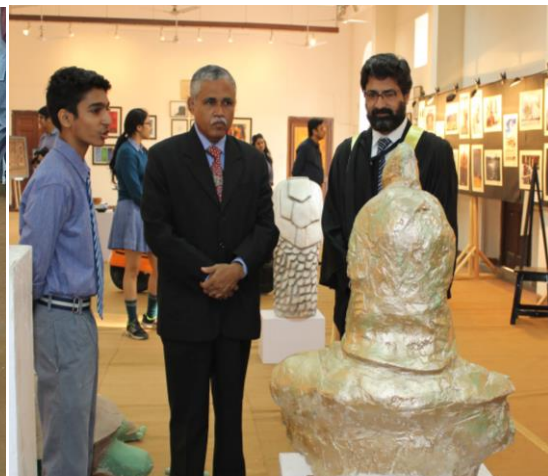
Students of the Sculpture Department actively showcased their work carved in wood, plaster of paris and thermocol.

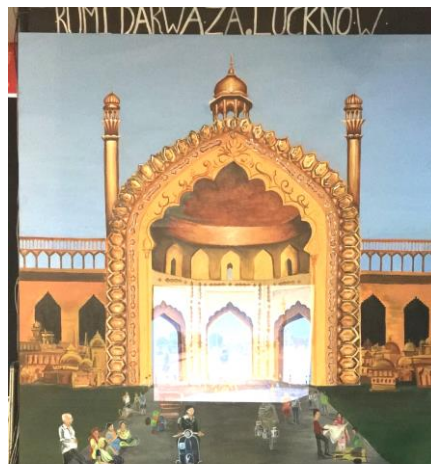
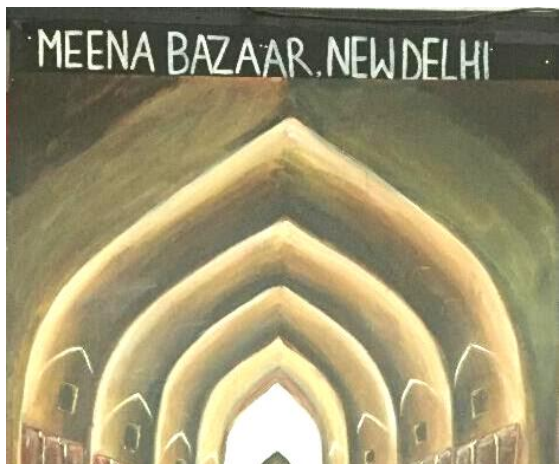
