

ASTRONOMY SESSION

The Astronomy Club module 2 session was held on 6th February 2017. This session taught the students about the Manual Barn Door Tracker used in the modern world to track celestial bodies. Knowledge about certain pointers of the pole star and the rotation of the earth was given before the session began. First the need of these trackers was discussed after which the characteristics of a good tracker were determined. The barn door tracker is a simple, easy and compact tracker for beginners. The students assembled their tracker with the help of the instructors. The students took a laser beam as an imaginary star and had to take a stationary photograph of the red dot of the laser. Each student got a chance to test all the things they had learnt in the session.
