# TALK ON ELECTORAL REFORMS

Four students from our school attended a talk at Vasant Valley School on 31st March 2017. Two highly esteemed speakers, namely Dr S.Y. Qureshi, the former Chief Election Commissioner of India and Mr Swapan Das Gupta, a senior Indian journalist and Member of Parliament, addressed a large number of students from schools from all over Delhi. The talk on 'Electoral Reforms in India' enlightened the students about the major problems faced by the electoral system in our country. They shed light on problems such as criminalization of politics, money power, use of black money in election

## ASTRONOMY OBSERVATION SESSION

#### "Man must rise above the Earth-to top of the atmosphere and beyond-for only thus will he fully understand the world in which he lives."

Students of the Astronomy Club of our School journeyed to Sariska for an Overnight Astronomy Observation Session on 24<sup>th</sup> March 2017. They learnt about the constellations, zenith and magnitude of stars.

They identified the stars on the basis of their brightness and learnt how to use the Plano sphere, to know on which day and at what time the constellation could be seen. They set up their own telescopes and witnessed a mesmerizing view of Jupiter, its ring and its four most visible moons, and also caught a beautiful glimpse of the planet Saturn! They were briefed about the DSLR cameras and then were asked to click pictures of various constellations and planets that could be seen using these Cameras.
