With this in mind, the students of our school attended the 35th edition of the MOD Debate held at Modern School, Vasant Vihar on the 4th May 2017. The debate had three rounds- a preliminary round inclusive of an extempore speech, a turncoat debate as well as a written 'bridge round'; the semis and of course the finals, which were conducted in a modified Parliamentary style. Mr. Pornob Mukherjee, a luminary of the Indian debating circuit, chaired the debate and created an enthralling atmosphere with his own unique and incomparable style. The Modern School team of Aatmik Gupta, Aryaman Sood and Shreyan Puri of S7 finished as the Second Best Team at the end of a rigorous day of debating. Aatmik Gupta was also adjudged the Best Speaker at the debate.



A TRIP TO PAHARPUR BUSINESS CENTRE

One of the few unsung heroes who work towards restoring the ecology of our planet is Mr Kamal Meattle. Mr Meattle's work in the field of environmental activism led him to develop the Paharpur Business Centre and Software Technology Incubation Park, to which the students of the Environment Club of our school took a trip on 29th March 2017. The Park is renowned for its status as a 'Platinum-rated, LEED-certified' building and is ranked as one of the healthiest offices in Delhi/NCR. As our students entered the complex, they could feel the effect of the change in air quality which is virtually unmatched in its low level of particulate content. The dedication towards well-being and comfort is equally matched by efficiency and productivity. The visiting students soon realised that the practices undertaken at the office have astonishing effects, including a 42% probability of a 1% increase in overall blood-oxygen level, which would imply a remarkable increase in cognitive functions and energy levels. The same is achieved in part by allowing the employees of the centre to derive recreation in a greenhouse area where several plants are housed. Our students were also treated to quick blood-oxygen measurement tests, before being ushered into a rapid tour of the entire complex. They were introduced to the numerous green features of the Centre, ranging from its 100% switchover to LED lights, to the installation of VFDs in its cooling towers, to the self-cleaning photovoltaic (PV) panels on its roof all supplemented by 4500 green plants installed at various strategic locations. By the time the tour was over, our students were not only

refreshed, but were truly aware of what a stellar example the building set for office spaces all across the country, if not the globe. Perhaps, the biggest take away from the experience was the realisation that the efforts of every single human being can have a profound impact on the health and sustainability of our planet.
