Sanya embarked upon her squash journey to realize her dream of representing her country in Squash at the highest level in May 2014. She took part in the **Gujarat Open**, her first tournament on the domestic circuit in October 2014 and showed potential by winning in the under 13 Category.

Over the next two and a half years, she has with sheer perseverance and dogged determination been able to become the **No.1 ranked player** in the Girls under 17 category in India. Her current ranking is **No.2** in the girls U-17 category in India.

Sanya was the youngest player in the Indian squad for the **18<sup>th</sup> Asian Junior Team Squash Championship** and in the **WSF World Junior Squash Championship** since both are under-19 events.

In July this year, she was also sponsored by the **Squash Racket Federation of India** for a three week training Camp in Alexandria, Egypt, which is considered the Mecca of squash. Sanya has also been doing the school proud by participating in the Inter Public School Competition (IPSC) and winning laurels.
